RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ➤ Food Preparation Maintains high standards of control for quality food production and service, according to Canada's food guide, follows operational procedures and menu plans for each week in addition to being entirely responsible for preparing food for children consisting of hot and cold food menu items.
- ➤ Sanitation, Safety, and Security Maintains an environment conducive to protecting the health and well-being of the Hub Centre's children through high levels of food safety and sanitation standards.
- Perform cleaning duties in program rooms, offices, washrooms, hallways, storage and other areas.
- > Sweeping, dust mopping floors and stairways, cleaning and disinfecting washroom facilities daily, refilling dispensers, emptying waste baskets, and removing trash, cleaning and shoveling entrances as required.
